REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10925

"AN ACT RENEWING FOR ANOTHER TWENTY-FIVE (25) YEARS THE FRANCHISE GRANTED TO REPUBLIC BROADCASTING SYSTEM, INC., PRESENTLY KNOWN AS GMA NETWORK, INC., AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7252, ENTITLED "AN ACT GRANTING THE REPUBLIC BROADCASTING SYSTEM, INC. A FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, INSTALL, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN RADIO AND TELEVISION BROADCASTING STATIONS IN THE PHILIPPINES"

> APPROVED INTO LAW ON APRIL 21, 2017

REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10926

"AN ACT EXTENDING FOR TWENTY-FIVE (25) YEARS THE FRANCHISE GRANTED TO SMART COMMUNICATIONS, INC. (FORMERLY SMART INFORMATION TECHNOLOGIES, INC.), AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. ENTITLED "AN ACT GRANTING **SMART** 7294, INFORMATION TECHNOLOGIES, INC. (SMART) A FRANCHISE TO ESTABLISH, MAINTAIN, LEASE AND **OPERATE INTEGRATED** TELECOMMUNICATIONS/COMPUTER/ELECTRONIC AND STATIONS THROUGHOUT THE SERVICES, PHILIPPINES FOR PUBLIC DOMESTIC AND

INTERNATIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"
